FACTORY RUNNING NIGHT AND DAY

Fully three hundred representative citizens of Hillsboro, with delegations from Orenco, Cornelius and other neighboring towns, attended the reception at the World Keepfresh Company's factory Saturday evening. The gathering was truly an earnest tribute to a worthy institution. The visitors were met at the west entrance and escorted in groups throughout the factory from the basement to the second

Then were shown a large number of crates of logan-berries being prepared for the night-run, for be it known the factory has run to its full, though, as yet limited, capacity every minute of the time since it opened, at the beginning of the strawberry season. Also quantities of rhubarb, string-beans, peas, cherries and other products, which have been treated by this remarkable system of food preservation.
