### **Mountain** water to CENTER OF THE CITY

Pipe Was Laid to First Last Evening Finishing Today

WATER IN MAINS IS MATTER OF HOURS

Well Water System Soon to be Affair

The workmen on the mountain water pipe line from Forest Grove to Hillsboro finished laving the big conduit into the city last evening, reaching the P. R. & N. track at noon yesterday. The gate was put in there, and the line tested between the two points. The ditch was practically finished last night to Third Street, and all the pipe will be laid either this afternoon or tomorrow morning early. Connection with the circulation mains is all, then, that is necessary, and Hillsboro will be enjoying mountain water. 'Tis a consummation devoutly to be wished," as Bill Shakespeare made one of his characters say.

The installation of this system means a great deal to Hillsboro. For over a year the wells have furnished an insufficient supply. and the inadequacy was a constant menace to the city. Property owners in the wooden ranges in the business district have quaked every time the fire bell talked, for a big fire anywhere, in the wooden range, either on Main or Second, would have endangered the entire business district. All this will be changed with the advent of Gales Creek

Lawns have dried up as a result of the water shortage, the city and company joining in a circular stopping the use of water for irrigation purposes, ten days ago.

The new suppy will probably get into the mains Friday, or, at the latest, by Saturday, and the company will then start construction on the Sain Creek project. A big reservoir will be built at in or near Dilley, and the pipe lines will be laid before the bad weather sets in. A great deal of concrete work will be necessary, and this will be well under way in a few weeks. The contract for supply from Forest Grove ends January 1 and the company proposes to have Sain Creek water here by that time
