HILLSBORO'S PRECINCTS LEAD ALL THE REST

South Hillsboro Has Over 400 Registered Voters on Books

NORTH COMES NEXT IN LINE The Court Must Divide and Add One or More Divisions

County Clerk J. W. Bailey gives the total registration of Washington County at over 5,000—the largest in the history of the county.

Hillsboro has the largest precincts in the county, South Hillsboro leading by over 400, while North is nearly up to the 400 mark. This means that there has been great growth in the city and surrounding section, and that the county court must soon divide the precincts and make one or two more.

South and North Forest Grove precincts follow with a good registration, but each will lack considerable of reaching the two county seat divisions.

Registration books closed last Saturday evening, and it is expected that a full vote will be polled. All parties are anxious to poll as large a vote as possible and the presence of the Progressive ticket, with Roosevelt electors, has added zest to the campaign.

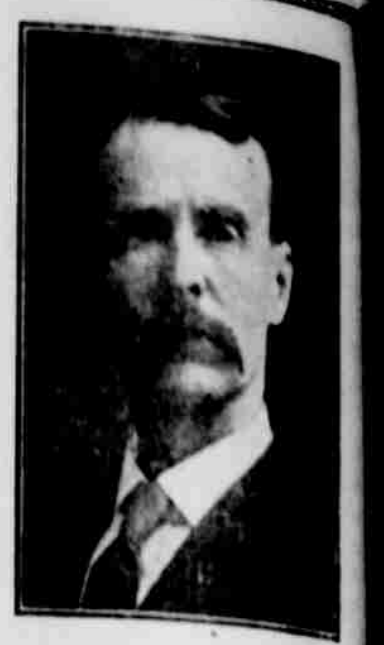
