Senator, was running for secretary of state; and T. A. McBride, now Supreme Judge, was running for district attorney. D. Gubser, David Smith, father of Attorney Mil-ton Smith, and Thos. Paulsen were on the legislative ticket; Rodolph Crandall was a candidate for judge: J. W. Morgan for clerk; Chas. Hickethier and T. G. Todd, for commissioners; J. S. Waggener, for treasurer, L. C. Walker, for surveyor; T. T. Vin-cent, for school superintendent; and C. W. Ransom, of Portland, then running a drug store in Hillsboro, was a candidate for coroner, Binger Herman, for years in congress, headed the ticket. It was a great reminder of the old days when Gov. Pennoyer was successful on his antimonopoly and anti-coolie ticket. The county ticket was universally successful.


