WILLIAM F. HOSTETLER

On last Wednesday morning, Oct. 30, as the shades of the silent night was drawing to a close, the spirit of Wm. F. Hostetler, a life-long resident of Walnut-creek township, Holmes county, took its flight, and thus the marital ties of a kind father and loving mother were forever broken. In his younger days Mr. Hostetler was serving in the capacity of teaching school for eleven years, after which he engaged in farming until his death. He held a number of township offices, and as County Commissioner at the time the Holmes county jail was built. He was a member of the Reformed church near his home. Served as Sunday school superintendent for 25 years, and secretary of the Missionary society for 33 years.

On March 25, 1870, he united in marriage with Louise Blaser. To this union were born twelve children—nine sons and three daughters, all living except three. Funeral services were held at the Reformed church near Trail, on Friday noon, Nov. 13, 1912, at 10 o'clock, Rev. J. H. Poetter, of Holgate, Ohio, conducting the services. He was laid to rest in the cemetery adjoining the church.—Ohio Budget.

The widow is a sister of Chief of Police Blaser, of Hillsboro, and Mr. Hostetler was the father of W. W. Hostetler, well known here and at Reedville, and of Mrs. J. J. Mays, a former teacher here, now residing at Donald, Ore., on the Electric, between here and Salem.
