

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO INCORPORATE THE CITY OF ORENCO.

To All Whom It May Concern:
Notice is hereby given that on Friday, the 14th day of December, 1912, at the next regular session of the County Court of the State of Oregon, for Washington County, the following petition will be presented to said County Court of the State of Oregon, for Washington County, to-wit:

In the County Court of the State of Oregon, for Washington County—In the matter of the incorporation of the City of Orenco in Washington County, Oregon.

To the Honorable County Court of the State of Oregon, for Washington County.

We, the undersigned qualified electors of Washington County, Oregon, residing within the limits of the proposed incorporated City of Orenco as herein-after bounded, respectfully petition your Honorable Body to make an order and give license to incorporate the proposed town of the City of Orenco for an election that the voters of said territory included in said boundaries hereinabove set forth may vote upon the question of incorporation of said city under the provisions of section 287 of Lord's Oregon Laws incorporating the City of Orenco, with its boundaries as follows:

Begins on the Main Line where the same intersects the Elbert's Donations Land Claim; thence west along the Base Line; thence east along the Base Line to the east boundary line of Orenco Acres; thence north along the east boundary of Orenco Acres to the south line of the Isaac Butler Donation Land Claim; thence east on the south line of said Butler Donation Land Claim to the southeast corner of the M. McDonald 96-acre tract as described in deed book 42, page 197, to point where the said east line of said Poote tract intersects the section line between Secs. 24 and 25 T. 1 N., R. 2 W. Will, more or less, thence west following the section line between Secs. 25, 26, 27 and 28 T. 1 N., R. 2 W. Will, to where said line intersects the west boundary line of Goss, W. Elbert's Donation Land Claim; thence south along the west line of said Elbert's Donation Land Claim, to point where the said east line of said Poote tract intersects the section line between Secs. 24 and 25 T. 1 N., R. 2 W. Will, more or less, thence west following the section line between Secs. 25, 26, 27 and 28 T. 1 N., R. 2 W. Will, to where said line intersects the west boundary line of Goss, W. Elbert's Donation Land Claim; thence south along the west line of said Elbert's Donation Land Claim, to point of beginning.

Your petitioners further represent that there are more than 150 inhabitants residing within the boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation as hereinbefore described, and further allege that there are 200 inhabitants actual residents within the confines of said boundaries as near as can be ascertained.

That each and all of the petitioners who signed this petition are qualified electors of Washington County, Oregon, and have resided within the boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation for a period of one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Wherefore your petitioners pray that upon the presentation of this petition that a hearing be had thereon, and the number of inhabitants residing within the confines of said boundaries be ascertained and determined, and that an order be made for an election to be held within said boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation, in accordance with section 287 of Lord's Oregon Laws, for the State of Oregon, and that the vote be held as herein canvassed and declared, as provided by said section, and if carried for incorporation, that an order be made in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, incorporating the City of Orenco, Washington County, Oregon, with the boundaries as hereinbefore described, or as may be determined by order previously made.
