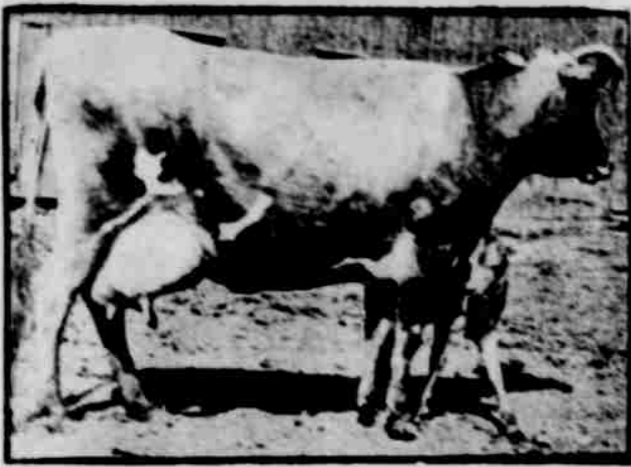

HONEYMOON IN AN AIR CRAFT

Husband One of the Practical and Daring Air Men of the Northwest

Married: At the Hotel Portland, Portland, Oregon, Tuesday, Nov. 19, 1912. Rev. W. A. M. Breck officiating. Silas Christofferson and Emma Edna Becker, the bride of Hillsboro, and the groom of Vancouver and Portland. The ceremony was performed in the hotel parlors in the presence of the relatives of the bride and groom, and a few invited friends.

Miss E. Bissner, a sister of the bride, was maid of honor. After the wedding Mr. and Mrs. Christofferson enjoyed their honeymoon tour in an air trip up the Columbia river. The groom is well known all over the Northwest as one of the most practical and well as most daring of the world's aviators, and he first came into prominence by flying from the roof of the New Multnomah Hotel, Portland, to Vancouver, Wash. His bride has made a number of ascents with him, and his machine is navigated as easily with a passenger as in solitaire.
