Wm. Baker, Who Shot up Cornelius, Fined One Hundred Dollars

PAID MONEY INTO COUNTY TREASURY

Wm. Wolf, Who is Charged With Non-Support, to be Tried March 24

Judge Campbell held a busy session of court Monday afternoon, and disposed of some criminal cases. On Tuesday afternoon, he heard the report of the grand jury.

Monday's calendar closed with the following dispositions:

Geo Hope, formerly of Seattle, pleaded guilty and sentence was deferred. He was indicted for stealing copper wire from the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Ry.

Alfred Whitlaw, alias Whitta, pleaded not guilty to assault with a dangerous weapon, and bail was fixed at \$100 cash; trial set for March 24.

Wm Wolf, of Beaverton, will next Monday plead to the charge that he is not supporting his minor child.

Wm Baker, who some time ago "shot-up" Cornelius, was fined \$100, and paid the U S coin. He was also sentenced to 6 months in the county jail, but was paroled on condition of good behavior, and that he drink no more liquor and keep out of bad company.
