Portland has a "Big Sisterhood", an unique society, which invites the interest and co-operation of mothers and daughters throughout the state of Oregon. This society is quite informal in its organization, its aim being to give friendly aid and counsel to girls who are alone in Portland, or who for any reason are in need of a "Big Sister." The work of the society is not offered as a charity, but is just the friendliness of one woman for another, or a "Big Sister" for a "Little Sister." If girls, or the parents of girls, who are going to Portland, will write to the "Big Sisterhood," care of the People's Institute, arrangements will be made to give them such attention as they may wish on reaching the city and their welfare will be looked after by "Big Sisters" who will take pleasure in knowing them and helping them.

The city council of Cornelius last week passed an ordinance, with an emergency clause, closing all saloons, and the marshal Saturday evening ordered the places of business of T. A. McCourt and P. J. Sonnen, to close doors. The case now rests with an injunction against proclamation of the dry vote of April 7, wherein the ordinance providing the election was claimed to be ineffective. The court had signed the injunction proceeding, but as there was no injunction, and could be none, against a new ordinance declaring that saloons must be closed, the latter method was chosen. Just where the case will end remains to be seen.

Christian Mosiman, of Helvetia, native of Switzerland, and aged 65 years, was this week adjudged insane by Judge Reasoner and ordered committed to the asylum. Dr. Erwin examined the patient, who has convulsive insanity, with two or three daily attacks. Mosiman is a bachelor, and has been in America about 24 years. He has had two brothers afflicted with mental trouble. Apoplexy is attributed as the cause. The complaint was sworn to by Alfred Guerber.

The little eight year old son of John Gates, of Leisyville, fell from a disc harrow, late Thursday evening last, while riding in from the field, his brother driving, and sustained a serious wound in the groin. The opening was three inches in length, the little lad falling on one of the disc. It required six stitches to close the wound. Dr. F. A. Bailey attended the little sufferer.

Elmer Johnson, of the Wilkes Abstract Co., Sunday received a telegram announcing the death of his brother, Rev. C. O. Johnson, of Pella, Iowa. Deceased was 50 years of age, and leaves a wife and three children. The death notice came as a surprise to the brother, as the Iowa brother was a man of splendid physique standing six-foot-six, and had always enjoyed fine health.

Miss Pearl Whitmore, aged 18, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Calvin Whitmore, of near Laurel suffered an operation for appendicitis, at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Portland, Sunday. At last reports the patient was getting along nicely and full recovery is anticipated.

The first Yakima Indian seen on Hillsboro's streets for many years was in town Sunday afternoon and Monday. He was here to identify horses stolen from him a year or so ago and brought to this county and sold. The old fellow was an up-to-date chief, and looked the part.
