Fortland has a "Big Sister ood", an unique society, which nvites the interest and co-operation of mothers and daughters and other members of families throughout the state of Oregon. This society is quite informal in its organization, its aim being to give friendly aid and counsel to girls who are alone in Portland, or who for any reason are in need of a "Big Sister," The work of the society is not offered as a charity, but is just the friendliness of one woman for another, or a "Big Sister" for a "Little Sister." If girls, or the parents of girls, who are going to Portland, will write to the "Big Sisterhood," care of the People's Institute, arrangements will be made to give them such attention as they may wish on reaching the city and their welfare will be looked after by "Big Sisters" who will take pleasure in knowing them and helping
