If the United States were not "holders" of the Philippines there wouldn't be any agitation over in Japan, nor any attempt to bluff us from legislation on the subject.

Miles J. Haines, of Sherwood, was in the city Monday, bringing in a prisoner, who was held by the Sherwood justice of the peace, the charge being a statu-tory offense. The man was unable to get bond and was placed in jail. The defendant's name is Earl Slater, and he and his aged mother have been living in a tent at Sherwood. The prisoner is not mentally balanced, and only for this fact it is said that Sherwood citizens would have roughly dealt with the culprit. The case is one of the most depraved that has ever been taken up by officials. The grand jury will investigate the case as soon as it again convenes.
