J. W. and Ben Marsh, of near Centerville, were in the city Friday. Ben was at Portland, the middle of the week, and underwent an operation by Dr. Rockey, the specialist.

Portland's mayor has signed the ordinance against saloons setting out free lunch, and this habit of the man who thrives on this sort of lunch counter is now disconsolate. There is nothing in the ordinance, however, to keep the bar from selling the luncheon.

Geo. Vandehey and Antone, his brother, of the Banks section, were in the city Monday, and bought tickets back to Stanley, Wisconsin, from which place they go to East Depere, their old home. They were ticketed East over the Oregon Electric and Hill lines, by Agent Cooper. They expect to remain East until haying time.

Contractor Bruce Gordon has turned up a solid block on Third, between Baseline and Oak, in order to make the top dressing take in good shape. It will be rolled and then another coat of rock and asphalt added. The street has been used all winter, and it was some work to remove the dirt and get the hard surface picked to pieces.

Dr. Lee Steiner, of the State Hospital for the Insane, has sent Dr. W. D. Wood, State Senator, 15 pheasant eggs, for setting purposes. Five are Reeves pheasant, five Golden, and five Mongolian pheasant, and the setting has been placed under a hen, and is now in process of warming up for hatching. He will turn the youngsters loose on his ranch.

Gay Lombard, known here, was defeated for the mayoralty nomination in Portland, last Saturday. A. G. Rushlight, the present incumbent, being renominated by a majority over all his opponents. The commission charter carried, however, and this will nullify all nominations. Rushlight will file his nomination, however, and a dozen others have done the same thing. Notwithstanding that women voted, the ballot was very light.

A. D. Lundstrom, a Beaverton resident, writes the Oregonian that he believes the rural sentiment is in favor of Oregon passing anti-Japanese legislation in the matter of land holding and land leasing. Mr. Lundstrom is unquestionably right in his premises. California is right in the attitude. It is just a question of diplomacy at this time, and the ghost of the Philippine Islands—that wise proposition fostered by the big bondholding class some years ago—will not be laid. If the United States were not "holders" of the Philippines there wouldn't be any agitation over in Japan, nor any attempt to bluff us from legislation on the subject.

Miles J. Haines, of Sherwood, was in the city Monday, bringing in a prisoner, who was held by the Sherwood justice of the peace, the charge being a statutory offense. The man was unable to get bond and was placed in jail. The defendant's name is Earl Slater, and he and his aged mother have been living in a tent at Sherwood. The prisoner is not mentally balanced, and only for this fact it is said that Sherwood citizens would have roughly dealt with the culprit. The case is one of the most depraved that has ever been taken up by officials. The grand jury will investigate the case as soon as it again convenes.
