Assessor Crandall's office is very busy these days, as a new law will take effect this year, on assessing and collecting. The Board of Equalization must meet the first week in September, this year, instead of the last week in October, and as a consequence assessments are being rushed. Green, Sherwood and Tualatin; J. J. Wismer, Washington and Beaverton, and Chas. Wescott, Gaston.

J. L. Stannard and wife, of Portland, passed through the city Monday, enroute for Sain Creek, where the Washington-Oregon people are working on the intake of the Hillsboro future water supply. He says the company will rush the work as rapidly as men and means will permit. Mr. Stannard has had charge of the entire survey of the company's pipe line.

Lincoln Lodge No. 161, Scholls, had its annual roll call last Saturday evening, and all report a splendid time. Seventy plates were laid and a fine supper was the result of Mr. and Mrs. J. W.
