FIRST—That your undersigned petitioners, constituting more than forty persons and all qualified electors of Washington County, Oregon, and are bona fide residents within the limits of the territory proposed to be incorporated as the City of Tualatin, and have resided within the boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation for more than thirty days next preceding the date of this petition.

SIXTH—That your petitioners and other residents of the unincorporated village known as Tualatin and of the territory hereinafter particularly described, are desirous of having an election held within and under the purview of incorporating said City of Tualatin.

THIRD—That the boundaries and limits of the territory herein proposed to be incorporated as the City of Tualatin are particularly bounded and described as follows, all that portion of Washington County, Oregon, lying and being within and described as follows:

Commencing at the northwest corner of lot No. 22, in Tualatin gardens, as shown on the duly recorded map and plat thereof, on record of record of Washington County, Oregon, said point being 16.89 chs. north of the southeast corner of section 22, T. 2, S. R. 1 W. W. M., running thence west on the N. line of lots No. 22 and 21 of said Tualatin gardens a distance of 169 feet, more or less to a point due south of the W. line of Fifth Street, in the town of Tualatin, Oregon, as shown on the duly recorded map and plat thereof, on file and of record in the office of the said Recorder of Washington County, Oregon; thence N. parallel with the E. line of said section 22, and passing on said course, along the W. line of said aforementioned Fifth Street, a distance of 70 chs. more or less to the N. line of said section 22; thence E. on said section line 169 feet, more or less, to the N. E. corner thereof; thence continuing E. on N. line of section 24, T. 2, S. R. 1 W. W. M., 7 chs. more or less, to the center of the Tualatin River; thence down the center of said river in a general southeasterly direction to a point where the said center line thereof first crosses a line 30 rods west of the Willamette Meridian, in the N. W. 1/4 of the N. E. 1/4 of said section 24; thence S. parallel with said Willamette Meridian to a point 10 rods S. of the line dividing the N. and S. halves of said section 24; thence W. to the W. line of J. E. C. Thompson's land; said point being 21.29 chs. E. and 10 rods S. of the quarter section corner on the W. line of said section 24; thence south to the center of creek, running through said land; thence W. following the center line of said creek to the line between sections 22 and 24, Township and range aforesaid; thence S. to the place of beginning.

FOURTH—That more than 150 inhabitants reside within the boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation as heretofore described, and that the number of actual inhabitants and residents within the confines of said boundaries is approximately 200 people.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray that upon the presentation of this petition, a hearing be had thereon, and that the boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation be established and defined as herein set out, and that the number of inhabitants residing within the confines of said boundaries be ascertained and determined, and that an order be made by this court for an election to be held within the boundaries of said proposed municipal corporation in accordance with sections 2287 and 2298 of Laws of Oregon, Laws of the State of Oregon and fixing a time and place where said election is to be held, and that notice of an election to be held in said proposed municipal corporation, for the purpose of determining whether the same shall become incorporated, be given for and during the time and in the manner prescribed by said section 2287, Laws of Oregon, and giving notice that the voters shall be required to cast ballots which shall contain the words "for incorporation" or "against incorporation" or words equivalent thereto, and also the names of persons voted for to fill the various elective municipal offices prescribed by law for municipal corporations so incorporated, and that the votes cast at said election be canvassed by the county court of Washington County, Oregon, on the first Wednesday of its regular term held after said election as provided by section 2303, Laws of Oregon, and if it appears after from such canvass made that a majority of the votes thus cast are in favor of incorporation, that an order be made in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon declaring such territory duly incorporated, a municipal corporation under the name and style of the City of Tualatin, and declaring the persons receiving respectively the greatest number of votes for such elective offices to be duly elected to such offices.

Lighting Pipe, Set Fire to Grass-line-Soaked Shirt

OLD TIMER ALWAYS COMES THROUGH

Says he is Now Ready to Tackle a Flying Machine

Zebulon Vance, the Yamhill farmer, residing near Newberg, who a few months ago burned his whiskers as clean as a barber could shave them, was in town yesterday, with a new grievance against things as they are and ought not to be. He had barely recovered from losing the tin of a finger while trying to whirl a wheel on a bicycle in a local garage, when he courted and caught another consignment of trouble. His boy—the old gentleman owns a good ranch and has the necessary—wanted an auto, and the head of the family bought one for the hopeful, and after the purchase the father concluded to learn all he could about autos. He did. In filling it with gasoline the other day he accidentally spilled a pint on his shirt. Later he went out to mow grass, and, desiring a smoke, loaded his dudded and carelessly struck a match on the nether side of his trousers. The ignition was close to where that grass had soaked in, and in a second he was all ablaze. He had the presence of mind to make three jumps, and landed in about ten feet of water in the channel of the Yamhill river. He put out the blaze and started for Hillsboro to get some unguents to apply to the scorches. The old gentleman was quite cheerful and says he is now ready to take on a flying machine or any other "darned improvement."

ASENATH CAROLINE LEVENS

Mrs. Asenath Caroline Levens died at Los Angeles, Cal., June 13, 1913, at the home of her son, Curtis Levens. She was born March 7, 1855, the daughter of pioneers of 1845, William and Angeline Catching, who emigrated to Oregon from Missouri, and settled on a donation land claim near Forest Grove. Her father died in 1874, and her mother, known to Oregon pioneers as "Grandma" Angeline Catching, died Sept. 29, 1910. Deceased was married to William Levens in 1873. Since 1883 she resided in Portland, with the exception of a few years residence in Hillsboro, in the eighties. Her surviving children are Curtis Levens, of Los Angeles, manager of a big mercantile firm; and Mrs. Angie Brown, who made her home with her mother, and who was with her at the time of death. Of her immediate family a sister, Mrs. Sarah J. Baldr, wife of Richard Baldr, of Hillsboro, and three brothers, Benjamin F. Catching, Wardner, Idaho, and Watson E. and Chas. H. Catching, of Missoula, Montana, survive.

The remains were brought to Portland, and burial took place on Wednesday, June 18, from Finley's undertaking parlors.

A. V. Brown, of Forest Grove, has been appointed by the State Forester as Supervising Warden for Washington County. He will have charge of all state, county and private patrol work in this county, and co-operate with forest supervisors of the national forests to the greatest possible extent. It is hoped that residents of the county will give him their hearty support and consult him in regard to burning permits, etc., of a local nature. He will be in touch with all local wardens and will gladly refer requests for information to the warden nearest you for any information or assistance he may be able to give. A list of local wardens with their addresses and telephone numbers, will be published when such appointments are made. It will be impossible for the state forester to personally inspect all the work done by the numerous supervising wardens in his employ, and their success will depend very largely upon the support they receive from the people whom the Forestry Law is intended to aid and protect.
