Word has been received here that Lorne Palmateer, son of G. J. Palmateer, figured in a terrible accident at San Diego, the other day. Palmateer is a policeman, and after he went off duty at eleven o'clock in the evening he took his auto and went to a hall to take a fellow policeman, by the name of Kirkland, home from a meeting. As they crossed a bridge Palmateer's machine met another auto, which crowded Lorne's machine into the railing. A board struck Kirkland in the abdomen, completely disemboweling him. Palmateer was thrown from the machine and was laid up in the hospital for two days before he recovered. Mrs. Kirkland was slightly injured. A coroner's jury absolved Palmateer from all blame. The man with the auto who crowded the machine to the rail can't be found.

Philip Galaino, a Greek barber, was arrested Friday morning on complaint of Wm. Brown, of Helvetia, charged with pointing a 22-calibre rifle at Brown. Brown alleges that the barber and wife had a row, and that the tonsonial artist took a shot at the woman, and that when he went over to see them, Galaino pointed the rifle at him and told him to "shoot" or he would shoot. The alleged offender was taken before Judge Smith and placed under \$2,000 bond to appear for examination. The woman left for Astoria, Friday morning, the next day after the alleged trouble.
