Grand Jury Sworn in and Start Investigation of Criminal Charges

### MANY CASES TO COME BEFORE BODY

Expect That the Seven Men Will be Busy for Several Days

Judge Campbell opened circuit court for the July term, Monday morning, and a transcript of the records shows the following orders:

Jury responded as follows: Chas. VanDoren, Nelson A. Miller, Jas J. Jack, Edward T. Murphy, Wm Koppell, J. W. Connell, Fred F. Lyda, Jas Jackson, F. W. Delsman, Peter Huffman, August Lovegreen, H. J. Hansen, Albert Bunning, Fred Sturms, Albert Jackson, John Samuelson, Wm Welch, Otto Wismer, Robert DeShazer, Jacob Schneider, H. B. Tigard, Ezra A. Kirts, Fred Caldwell, Alfred Zweiner, Leonard Tompkins.

The following grand jury was drawn by lot by Clerk Luce: Alfred Zweiner, Jacob Schneider, Wm Koppell, Albert Bunning, Loren Jackson, Chas VanDoren, Edward T. Murphy. Albert Bunning was appointed foreman, and the inquisitive body retired to investigate criminal charges.
