### SUPT. B. W. BARNES IN ANNUAL REPORT

Pupils of School Age, According to Census, 8,098, for the Year

ONE HUNDRED NINETY-TWO TEACHERS

Nearly Ninety Thousand Dollars Expended for Teachers' Salaries

County School Supt. B. W. Barnes has concluded his annual report for the year ending June 1, and the paper has many items of interest. In the children of school age the boys predominate over the girls at a ratio of 4180 to 3918, and the teachers employed give the ladies the best of it over the "lords of creation" by a score of 147 to 45.

Supervisor Jack reports that he made 176 visits to schools during the year, traveling 2709 miles, at expense, outside of salary, of \$288.30. Finds ten school houses not satisfactorily sanitary, and reports fifteen that have been improved along that line. He says that all doors now swing outward in conformity to law.
