POSTMASTER EXAMINATION

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that on November 22, 1913, an examination will be at Tualatin, Ore., as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth class postmaster at Tualatin, Oregon, and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interests of the service to fill the vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$370.00 for the last fiscal year.

Age limit, 21 years and over on the date of the examination. Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the post office for which the examination is announced. The examination is open to all citizens of United States who can comply with the requirements.

Application forms and full information can be secured from the postmaster at Tualatin or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C.

Application should be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington within 7 days before the date of the examination, otherwise it may be impractical to examine the applicants.

NOTICE TO FRUIT GROWERS

Now is the time to spray for apple-tree anthracnose, a disease which is rapidly destroying our older apple orchards and seriously menacing the younger ones. It is responsible for the dead tops and the ugly, canker-like spots on the limbs, often occurring so close together as to cause the limbs to break when loaded with fruit. Winter strength lime-sulphur may be used with good results, but it should be applied every year about this time. If trees are badly infected, as most of our old farm orchards are, spray with Bordeaux Mixture of the 6-6-50 formula. This means six pounds of bluestone, six pounds of clean stone lime and 50 gallons of water.

This combination is the most efficient fungicide known, but its efficiency depends on the care used in its preparation. Since combined, unless used at once, it follows that the apple grower should make the mixture himself, and not rely on the prepared article. A full account of the method of preparation would require too much space to be set forth here. The reader is therefore referred to pages 54 and 55 of the 12th biennial report of the State Board of Horticulture. This may be had by writing to the secretary, H. M.
