Wesley Brice Goodin, eldest son of Hon. and Mrs. J. W. Goodin, died at the family home near North Plains, Saturday afternoon, Nov. 1, 1913, from an attack of spinal meningitis. He was born at Glenrose, Ore., November 26, 1896, on the home place, where he passed away. When the family resided in Hillsboro, several years ago, he suffered a severe illness, and never was as strong afterward. He was a student of the Eighth Grade in the North Plains schools, and was a universal favorite among his schoolmates. He leaves his parents, a sister, Mrs. James Batchelder, and a brother, Melville, to mourn his loss.

The funeral took place from the Tualatin Plains Presbyterian Church, Monday afternoon, Rev. Andrew Carrick officiating at the obsequies. The pall bearers, selected from among his young friends, were Elmer Batchelder, Robt. Greer Jr., Charles Deichman, Robert Imber, Versey Bellinger and Edward Walters.

The remains were laid at rest in the Tualatin Plains cemetery, and the floral offerings were indicative of the high esteem in which the young man was held. A large concourse of friends attended the funeral.

W. B. DOLAN

COUNTY SCHOOL NEWS

The library books for the schools of Washington county are now ready for distribution, and the amount of money expended for books this year is \$821.29, covering 1488 volumes.
