### WESLEY BRICE GOODIN

Wesley Brice Goodin, eldest son of Hon. and Mrs. J. W. Goodin, died at the family home near North Plains, Saturday afternoon, Nov. 1, 1913, from an attack of spinal meningitis. He was born at Glencoe, Ore., November 25, 1896, on the home place, where he passed away. When the family resided in Hillsboro, several years ago, he suffered a severe illness, and never was as strong afterward. He was a student of the Eighth Grade in the North Plains schools, and was a universal favorite among his schoolmates. He leaves his parents, a sister, Mrs. James Batchelder, and a brother, Melville, to mourn his loss.

The funeral took place from the Tualatin Plains Presbyterian Church, Monday afternoon, Rev. Andrew Carriek officiating at the obsequies. The pall bearers, selected from among his young friends, were Elmer Batchelder, Robt. Greer Jr., Charles Deichman, Robert Imbrue, Versey Bellinger and Edward Walters. The remains were laid at rest in the Tualatin Plains cemetery, and the floral offerings were indicative of the high esteem in which the young man was held. A large concourse of friends attended the funeral.

### W. B. DOLAN

W. B. Dolan died Oct. 25, 1913, at his home, 508 East Clay St., Portland, aged 31 years.  
Mr. Dolan was born in Folkestone, England, and came to Oregon when nine years old. He lived in Portland since then, with the exception of four years spent in Hillsboro, where he followed his trade of sheet metal work. He was chief of the fire department while here. The following firemen from Hillsboro acted as pall-bearers: F. E. Harttramp, A. E. Luther, L. S. Kalpin, J. H. Hensley, R. L. Sears and Edwin Morgan.  
Mr. Dolan was married in 1906 to Miss Corina Becker. He leaves a widow and one small son; also three sisters and one brother.  
The funeral was largely attended by friends and relatives, and the floral offerings were magnificent.  
Interment was in the Lone Fir Cemetery.

### COUNTY SCHOOL NEWS
