SHERWOOD INJUNCTION WAS GRANTED

Attorneys for Wiley Will Attack Election Legality at Once

The county court Monday issued the prohibition order for the City of Hillsboro, shortly after Judge Campbell ruled that he would not sign the temporary injunction restraining issuance of the county court manifesto. The circuit rourt allowed the temporary injunction in the Sherwood case, as the pleading set up the names of voters who, it was alleged, did not have the right to vote on the city prohi election. Attorney H. Tongue, acting for County Attorney E. B. Tongue, contested the application for injunction at Oregon City, Friday, and again in circuit court, here, Monlay, contending that the charges of illegal voting for Hillsboro were not sufficiently specific, inasmuch as the names of the electors were not set out.

Attorney Geo. R. Bagley, of Bagley & Hare, counsel for Wiey, stated that the legality of the election would again come to issue about Dec. 1, and he then expected sufficient evidence to win their case. Access to the poli lists is now possible, and the case goes to trial Dec. 1.
