CYNTHIA JANE JULIAN

Mrs. Cynthia Jane Shaw Julian died at her home on Iowa Hill, 6 miles south of Cornelius, Nov. 19, 1913, after an illness of several months. Cynthia Shaw was born near Springfield, Mo., Jan. 28, 1848, and crossed the plains to Oregon with her parents, in 1853, the family settling near McMinnville. She was married to Thomas Loudon, Jan. 28, 1863, at Fort Walla Walla, Wash., and they shortly afterward settled near Glenoee, north of Hillsboro, where they resided until 1884 when they moved to Corbett, Ore., where Mr. Loudon died in 1888. Seven children were born to the union—S. T. Loudon, of Eddyville, Ore.; Chas. W., of St. Cloud, Florida; Jas. N., of Cornelius, Route 2; Mrs. Florence Hatcher, of Portland; T. H., of Governors Island, N. Y.; Mrs. Elizabeth Willis, of San Diego, Cal.; all surviving; and Oliver J. Loudon, deceased.

Mrs. Julian felt the end coming some time ago, and disposed of her property, giving her husband, Mr. Julian, a life lease on the place, and the personal property to her son, J. N. Loudon.
