The Washington-Oregon Corporation, in its annual report to the auditor of the State of Washington, gives the earnings of its plant with headquarters at Hillsboro, as follows: Earnings—electric light system, \$26,635.54; expenses, \$17,187.62; net, \$9,447.92; water earnings, \$8,757.56; expenses, \$4,993.59; net, \$3,763.97. In this table it will be remembered that the water for the greater part of the year was bought from Forest Grove. Next year the plant will be winner on this, as Sain Creek water has been flowing in the mains for several months.
