This being the first meeting, the forenoon session was devoted to the business matters and the election of officers for the ensuing year, viz:

When the Association adjourned for noon they were invited to a splendid luncheon, prepared by the Ladies Civic Improvement Club of Cornelius, which attested much for the culinary art of the ladies.

At the opening of the afternoon session the teachers were entertained by an interesting number given by the little girls of the Cornelius school. There were many parents present at this session, and they manifested much interest in the proceedings, especially in the lecture given by Prof. C. H. Learning, of Pacific University, on the subject "Drugs and Drug Habit."

That all the teachers of the county, as well as the parents, may have a better idea of what the Association is for, and what it hopes to do, one clause of the constitution is quoted here:

"The object of this society shall be to assist its members to attain a higher professional standard, to assist the county Superintendent in conducting both county and local institutes, to extend the hand of fellowship to new teachers, and to strive to better the general school condition and the welfare of the teachers of the county."

SUMMONS.

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Washington County.
State of Oregon, Plaintiff, vs. Frank Hoverton and all persons who claim to be heirs at law or next of kin of Chas. W. Tarlton, deceased, and all persons claiming an interest of the estate of said deceased, Defendants.

This matter coming on, to be heard upon the application of the State of Oregon, by E. B. Tongue, District Attorney for the Fifth Judicial District of Oregon, and by John M. Wall, special attorney for the State of Oregon, specially appointed by the Governor for the purpose of filing information and complaint to escheat to the State of Oregon the real property owned and formerly in the possession of Chas. W. Tarlton, deceased, and it appearing to the court that in accordance with a petition filed in the County Court of the State of Oregon for Washington County on January 14th, 1913, in the estate of Chas. W. Tarlton, deceased, it is alleged and set out therein that the said Chas. W. Tarlton on or about the 10th day of May, 1895, disappeared from the vicinity in which he was living and upon the land which he owned and hereinafter more particularly described, and therein further alleged that on or about said date the said Chas. W. Tarlton died intestate leaving no heirs at law or next of kin; that at the time of the death of the said Chas. W. Tarlton and for some time prior thereto the said deceased resided in Washington County, Oregon; that he left an estate in said county consisting of real property and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the S. E. corner of Andrew Anderson's 5 acre tract, as per deed recorded in Book "229" on page 74 of Deed Records of Washington County, Oregon, and being in Section 16, T. 1 S. E. 1 W. of the Will. Mer.; thence South 1.42 chs.; thence North 81 deg. 27' 15" E. 7.15 chs.; thence North 1.42 chs.; thence South 81 deg. 30' East 7.15 chs. to the place of beginning, containing 1 acre.

And it further appearing to the Court that the estate said Chas. W. Tarlton, deceased, is seized in fee simple of the said real property and of the whole thereof; that on the 14th day of January, 1913, one Alfred Davies, a resident of Washington County, Oregon, was appointed administrator de bonis non of said estate and thereafter said administrator proceeded to take possession of the property of said estate, and after fully administering, thereon and paying off all legal claims and demands against said estate did, on the 26th of May, 1913, file in the County Court of said county his final account by which there was shown to be on hand at said time the real estate above described estimated of the value of \$200.00; that said Court, on or before June 10, 1913, duly approved said final account and made an order fully settling said estate, discharging said administrator and his bondsmen from further liability thereon.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the defendants above named and all persons who claim to be heirs at law or next of kin of Chas. W. Tarlton, deceased, and all persons claiming an interest in said estate appear and show cause, if any they have, within six weeks from the date of the first publication of this order, to-wit, on or before six weeks from the 13th day of November, 1913, why the title to said real estate should not vest in the State of Oregon, and that said order be published each week for six successive and consecutive weeks in the Hillsboro Argus, a weekly newspaper published in the County of Washington, State of Oregon, and of general circulation therein.
