HOMESTEADER SUICIDES IN HIS HOME AT BACONA

Martin P. Schuster, a Bavarian, Dies by the Rope, Aged 35 Years

AFFLICTED WITH RELIGIO-INSANITY

Thought Bible Should be Revised, and

Martin P. Schuster, aged 35 years, hanged himself to a rafter of his cabin, one day last week, presumably Tuesday or Wednesday, near Bacona. He was found Sunday morning by Mrs. Bell Grossman, a neighbor woman, who went over to the Schuster place to see about buying some hay. When she knocked and received no response she looked through the window and saw Schuster, with his knees touching the bed, and with his body suspended from a rafter.

Schuster was last seen by Mrs. Grossman on Tuesday, when he

came over to get his mail. Coroner Barrett went to the Schuster place, Monday, and held an inquest, the jury bringing in a verdict of self-destruction. The jury consisted of C C Nelson, C F Harding, Peter Hoffman, J B

Ohler, Dave Casner, Jno Johnsen, That Schuster was deranged goes without saying, as he had told Mr. Nelson, a few days ago, that a man's life, if he lived No Knife, No Drugging. He right, was 40 years, and that if a man drank only rain water he could commune with spirits. He correctly paraphrased, and that if it were translated properly all was then revising it.

Schuster had a likely homestead, where he had lived seven years, and 1200 fruit trees grace the place. He had proved up, and had but few debts. A little over three dollars in silver were found on his body. One lid was removed from the stove, as though he were about to build a fire, and then concluded to suicide. Schuster was tully dressed, excepting that he did not have on his shoes.

A brother in Portland came out Tuesday, and had the remains removed to Portland for interment.

ALFRED EMMOTT

Alfred Emmott, of Hillsboro, died at the home of his son, Homer Emmott, Sunday, December 14, 1913, after an illness extending over several months. He was born in Yorkshire, England, August 16, 1837, and moved to Iowa in 1867. He was married to Mrs. Lydia M. Hunter, in lowa, Sept. 23, 1869, and to this union four children survive: Homer R., Louis F., George, Hillsboro, and Mrs. Charles Fisher, of Tacoma, Wash. Three survive who were his step-children: W. R. and Wm. Hunter, of Shelton, Wash., and Mrs. Ida Wehnes, of Tacoma,

He moved from Iowa to Shelton, Wash., in 1892, later moving to Tacoma, where his wife passed away in April, 1906. He came to Hillsboro in 1907, and made his home with his son, Louis F., until May 1, 1910, when he married Mrs. Adele Anderson, who died June 25, 1912. Since that date he has made his home with his son, Homer,

The funeral took place Tuesday, services being held at the M. E. church, at 11:30, and the remains were shipped to Tacoma, Wash., where interment was by the side of his wife.
