EDW. NAYLOR CASE BACK

Bagley & Hare Win Signal Victory in Criminal Case From the Grove  
ARGUED BEFORE COURT SATURDAY  
Error of Lower Court, Says Supreme Court, Gives Another Trial  
Bagley & Hare Tuesday received the intelligence that the Supreme Court had reversed the case of State versus Edw. Naylor, of Forest Grove. This was the case wherein Naylor, a brother of Geo. F. Naylor, was indicted for unlawfully living with Martha Traver. He was convicted Jan. 25, and sentenced to pay \$150 and costs, March 1. The case was at once appealed to the Supreme Court, and briefs were filed this Summer. Notices that argument were to be heard the last of the week were sent the attorneys, and the last of the week Mr. Tongue, for the state, and Mr. Bagley, for the defendant, went to Salem and made oral presentations of their sides. The case was decided Tuesday morning.
