The Prohibition mass convention for Washington County was called to order yesterday morning, and Rev. Daniel Staver, of Forest Grove, presided over the deliberations.

Fifty delegates from the county-at-large were elected to the state convention.

The executive committee to take care of the campaign was selected as follows—Daniel Staver, chairman; J. M. Barber, vice chairman; both being from Forest Grove; G. N. Taggart, Hillsboro, now on the council, second vice; treasurer, Richard A. Carlie; secretary, Miss Emma Taylor, of Forest Grove.
