### UNION STOCK YARDS

Receipts for the week have been cattle, 1253; calves, 3; hogs, 4209; sheep, 3668.  
Cattle market steady to firmer this week. Best light weight steer top up to \$8 again. Better beef demand as Easter approaches. Butcher stock in good position, with strong call for choice cows and heifers, which are selling from 6.75 to 7.  
Hog market irregular with a weak tendency, and tops hovered around 8.70 and 8.75 most of the week and closed 8.60 to 8.70. Receipts continue liberal.  
A firm sheep house with both mutton and lamb on higher level. Wool wethers at 5.50, and ewes at 5.25 are 25c better bids than those ruling ten days ago. First 1914 spring lambs selling "off cars" at 10 and 10.75 featured the late session. Liquidation did not meet requirements.
