Shot Himself With Revolver at Home of Son-in-Law in Portland

Despondent Over ill Health Supposed to Have Caused Rash Act

Sherburne Wilson, for many Stewart Timber Co to R F Barker, years a resident of Hillsboro, shot himself with a revolver Sunday afternoon, April 12, at W Hosen Wood to Oregon Realty & the home of his son-in-law, in Nellie Monical to Same, int in T A Portland, on Gantenbein Avenue. The family, with the exception of the son-in-law, were away | W.P. Bell to W.E. Johnson, 3 tracts from home. Hearing a shot in the rear, the son-in-law investigated, and found Mr. Wilson sitting on a wheelbarrow, with a bullet in the temple. Dr. G. W. Tamiesie was summoned, and after an examination told them that death was certain in a few hours. Wilson died about eight

o'clock the same evening.

Mr. Wilson was born in Pennsylvania, and was aged 83 years. He came to Oregon in 1878, settling in Hillsboro, where he worked as an artisan. He had the respect of the community, and was noted for his sturdiness of purpose. With a large family of young children, the loss of his wife told heavily on him, but he kept them together and raised them ereditably. Two sons, Chas. and Fred, and two daughters, Mrs. W. H. Black and Mrs. Emma Wood, survive.

Mr. Wilson belonged to the Masonic fraternity, and the remains were shipped to Hillsboro for interment.

No inquest was held.


