### CIRCUIT JURY CONVICTS DONAHUE OF LARCENY

Charged With Stealing 500,000 Feet of Timber, on United

VERDICT JOINED WITH MERCY PLEA

Logger and Sawmill Man of Groveland Tried Friday and Saturday

Friday and Saturday witnessed the trial of J. M. Donahue, charged with larceny of 500,000 feet of logs from the land owned by Mrs. Elizabeth Freeman, on the former Otchin place, near Groveland. It appeared from the evidence that Donahue had negotiated for some timber and that Mrs. Freeman had set a price upon representation that there was a certain amount of sawlogs in the lot. When it came time for the contract to be signed Mrs. Freeman had discovered that the cruise greatly exceeded that represented by Donahue, and she told him not to cut any of the trees. Donahue, however, went on the place and cut and hauled off logs, even after being told by Thos. H. Tongue not to take any timber, he representing Mrs. Freeman. The jury was out about an hour when a verdict of guilty as charged was reached.

The jury sent in a plea of mercy to the court, however. The jury: Wm Thornburgh, A W Wright, John Olson, A V Denny, Samuel Graf, foreman, Ed Morton, Chas Farnham, Chas Casteel, W P Brooks, Geo C Thompson, Ernest Olson, Jos Downs.

As a sequel to the trial, Bagley & Hare Saturday evening filed a suit against Donahue & Co., for the value of timber and damages. The complaint alleges that Donahue cut 851,474 feet of logs, part of which were sawed into lumber, and part of which were left on the ground. Triple damages are asked, the value of the timber being placed at \$1729.48. The amount prayed for is therefore \$5,108.84.
