## NO BIDS SUBMITTED ON MACADAM WORK MAZDA

Laying of Rock Will be Done by Direction of the Court

BIDS ONLY ON HAULING & CRUSHING

Court Has a Busy Day Saturday Contractors Shy on Road Making

Contractors were very timid about bidding on macadam work toward cheaper to the fourteen miles of rock road to be built by the county this year, and when bids were opened last Saturday afternoon not one solitary bid was submitted for laying the rock and rolling it ready tor travel. There were a number of bids on hauling, however, and some of the bidders were awarded contracts. In one instance there was also a bid on crushing, and this, too, was awarded.

The court made an order directing the supervisors to go ahead with the macadamizing, under the direction of the county court, or the road master, Mr. Chapman, as the court decides. Crushers are being prepared, and just as soon as rock can be crushed the good work will begin. The bids of W. R. Cunnington and Fred Lursman, for hauling in District No. 1, were rejected, and the supervisor will proceed to get the hauling done.

In District No. 6, which embraces South Hillsboro, Neiss Larsen and sixteen others, put in bids ranging from 10 cents per yard for the 20th quarter, and they were awarded the contract.
