BIG PARADE TO BE A FEATURE

Knights Will Have an All Night Session, With Banquet, June 6

The Knights of Pythias of three counties—Washington, Yamhill and Tillamook—will convene in annual district convention, at Forest Grove, on Saturday afternoon, June 6, and hold an all night session. The convention will be "Good of the Order" all the way through, and the usual ritualistic work will be relegated to the rear.

The session will be "get together," and there will be a banquet such as only Forest Grove Knights know how to prepare; the Hillsboro Pythian minstrels will put on a show, and Yamhill will be down with vaudeville—while Gaston will have a prominent place on the program.

Chancellor Buxton, of Forest Grove, has a big committee at work to make it pleasant for the expected 250 visitors, and he has engaged the Star theatre for the exercises, after ten o'clock in the evening.
