JURY DISAGREES

The jury disagreed in the case of B. M. Nordin versus the Lovegren Lumber Company, suit wherein plaintiff asked for \$35,000 damages for injuries sustained December 15, 1913, while sniping logs for the Cherry Grove mill. Nordin complained that one side was paralyzed as a result of being struck on the head by a vine maple, which had been struck by a cable which was hitched to a log. His skull was fractured, and it was necessary to trephine. He says he will never again be able to work. The jury, it is understood, was very nearly divided on the question of damages. The company fought the contention that they had been negligent, and their foreman swore that nothing was left undone to make things safe for the man logging. The jury: Ed. Morton, George Tompkins, J.
