The famous McNulty escheat case was started Monday morning, with a jury as follows—Cornelius Vandebey, Chris Peterson, J B McNew, W B Peterson, John Conzelman, Geo N Harris, Geo W Clark, Julius Croen, Jack Latta, Chas E Hedge, Wm Cimino and Chas Bateman.

This is a case where many heirs claim an interest in the estate of James McNulty, an Irish sailor, who settled at Sherwood many years ago, and finally became quite wealthy. After his death a number of heirs, all the way from Ireland to the Mississippi Valley, asked for recognition in the probate court. The State of Oregon started escheat proceedings and became a party, and the matter will now be settled by the court higher up.
