ESLIE MILLER

Esle Miller, son of Mr. and Mrs. John C. Miller, of the Arcade district, passed away Saturday morning, August 1, 1914, at three o'clock, after an illness covering several months, the greater portion of which he spent in a sanitarium. His affliction was tuberculosis. For several years he has been employed at the United States Customs House, where he was a faithful employee. He was well known in and around North Plains and the northern part of the county, and worked for Mays Bros. for a considerable time, several years ago. He was a young man of exemplary habits, and had a host of friends. He was born in the Arcade district, Feb. 2, 1884. The funeral took place Sunday, interment being in the Arcade cemetery, Rev. B. C. Cook conducting the funeral services. A large concourse of friends attended the last rites, and the splendid floral tributes were indicative of the high esteem in which the young man was held.

His parents and surviving brothers, Charles and George, have the sympathy of a large circle of friends.
