CASH PRIZES FOR DAIRY STOCK

School Parade and School Exhibits are to be Features

The officers of the County Fair, which will be held Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, September 23, 24 and 25, are making every effort to make the fair even more of a success this year than it was last. Success in this direction, however, will depend in large measure upon the support that is given the effort by the people throughout the county.

People should not hesitate to bring out their products this year because it has been a dry season and they may feel that products are not as good as usual. Every one is affected the same by the season, so no one has any advantage, and premiums will be paid just the same, on the best products the season affords.

As the premium list is arranged this year there is opportunity for every exhibitor to win a cash premium.

The Oregon Electric R. R. Co. is offering a valuable and handsome bronze clock as a first premium on Individual Farm Exhibits. This is accompanied by liberal cash premiums.

The Southern Pacific has also signified its intention of contributing liberally to the premium list.

The Pacific Coast Condensed Milk Co. offer a valuable silver cup as first premium on a grade dairy herd, to consist of a pure bred sire of one of the dairy breeds and four females, ranging in age from a cow three years old or over down to a heifer under one year old. Good cash prizes are also given in this class and it affords a splendid opportunity for some of our dairymen to show the quality of the dairy stock of the county.

Another very interesting class should be the grade draft horse teams. Good cash prizes are offered for the best teams weighing over 2800 and for the best teams weighing under 2800, to be hitched to trucks or farm wagons.

It is hoped the ladies will this year bring out good exhibits of jellies and canned fruits and vegetables. Nothing makes a more attractive display than these articles and good premiums are offered in these classes.

The Eugenic Baby show again promises to be one of the big features of the Fair. Inquiries are already coming in and the classes in this department will undoubtedly be well filled.

In addition to the fine line of exhibits and the premiums offered, the management has also arranged for a big list of attractions that will amuse and entertain those attending. This feature of the county fair is important and the committee in charge promise a program for each day that will be pleasing to all.
