Swine trade steady to firm throughout. Best quality light stock 9 to 9 25. Smooth heavy weights 8 to 8 25. Receipts somewhat smaller compared with a week ago.  
Both mutton and lambs in strong position. Yearling wethers advanced 10 to 15 cents. Fancy lambs brought 6, and fat killing ewes 4 35. Outlet broad and demand steady. Receipts comparatively light.
