SCHOLLS GRANGE FAIR GIVES GREAT PROMISE Stock Department Will Have a Goodly Number of Entries FAIR TO BE THE BEST YET GIVEN Dates Have Been Set at Friday and Saturday, October 16th and 17th

Scholls Grange, which gives a fair each year, has determined that the 1914 affair shall be the best ever given in that section, and that it will be a wonderful exhibition of what that section of the county can do goes without saying. The stock department, a new feature, will include exhibits of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep and goats. There will be ribbon prizes awarded by the Grange, and some very fancy premiums offered by individuals. A two days' milk-cow contest will be held under the direction of the State Dairy Commissioner. There will be a juvenile exhibit, a poultry show, and the farm products show will be the most extensive of all. Domestic science and housewifery—and this is where Scholla has no contenders that rank higher—will be given the fullest chance—and if Scholla does not show the public a splendid fair it will not be because of lack of effort. Many Hillsboro people are talking of attending this fair, and the people of the county are cordially invited by the committee to come and see what the lower Tualatin territory can produce. Three large tents have been secured, and a fine camping ground has been selected for the benefit of those who wish to remain the two days.
