IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON: You are hereby requested to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit within six weeks from the date of the first publication of this notice, to-wit: the 16th day of October, 1914, and if you fail so to do for want thereof, plaintiff will take judgment and decree against you as prayed for in plaintiff's complaint, as follows, to-wit:

FIRST: That a money judgment be entered for the sum of Five Hundred Forty Dollars (\$540) and interest from March 1, 1914, until paid, at the rate of eight (8) per cent. per annum, and for the further sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) as attorney's fees and plaintiff's costs and disbursements against the defendants, A. L. Harrison and Phoebe Harrison, his wife, in favor of the plaintiff herein.

SECOND: That a money judgment be entered for the sum of Five Hundred Forty Dollars (\$540) and interest from March 1, 1914, until paid, at the rate of eight (8) per cent. per annum, and for the further sum of Nine Hundred Fifteen and 29-100 Dollars (\$915.29) together with interest from January 1, 1914, at the rate of six (6) per cent. per annum until paid, and for the further sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) as attorney's fees, and for plaintiff's costs and disburse-

ments against the defendant, Arthur G. Harbaugh, and in favor of the plaintiff.

THIRD: That a money judgment be entered for the sum of Two Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$270) and interest thereon from March 1, 1914, at eight (8) per cent. per annum until paid, and for the further sum of Four Hundred Fifty-seven and 64-100 Dollars (\$457.64) and interest thereon until paid from January 1, 1914, at the rate of three (3) per cent. per annum, and for the further sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) attorney's fees, and for one-half plaintiff's costs and disbursements and against the defendant, W. H. Merrick, and in favor of the plaintiff.

FOURTH: That the usual decree of foreclosure for the sale of all of the West half of the Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-four (24) in Township Three (3) North, Range three (3) West, of the Willamette Meridian, containing eighty (80) acres, more or less, situated in Washington County, State of Oregon, be entered, and that the Sheriff duly sell the same according to the law and practice of this Court.
