Supt. B. W. Barnes Makes the October Apportionment

FIFTEEN THOUSAND FROM THE STATE

Hillsboro School District Gets the Largest Sum of all

The annual County Institute will be held at Hillsboro, Nov. 4, 5 and 6, closing at noon on Friday. A strong program is being arranged.

A number of Parent-Teacher clubs have been organized this year, and others are being planned. The work of these clubs last year did very creditably and they are 30 in number.

The standardization of the schools has already materially improved many of them.

The grounds are being cleaned up, the flag goes up, and a general clean-up time is set. The Oreoco school was the first in the county to meet the requirements of standardization. Several others are now ready to receive the last seal as soon as they can be visited.

County School Superintendent B. W. Barnes has sent out to the school clerks the October apportionment. The total amount is \$41,367.83; \$15,210.70 is from the state irrevocible school fund, and \$27,157.13 from the county fund. The state fund amounts to \$1.65 per capita for each individual in the district between the ages of four and twenty. The county fund, after taking out \$100 for each district and \$5 for each school room in operation last year in the district, provided the teacher attended the annual institute 16 hours, amounted to \$17,507.32. The school districts of the county refunded to the county school fund \$1263.07 on account of not having spent 85 per cent. of the money apportioned to them last year for teachers' wages. The districts received the following amounts:

REPUBLICAN AND PROGRESSIVE NOMINEE FOR JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT

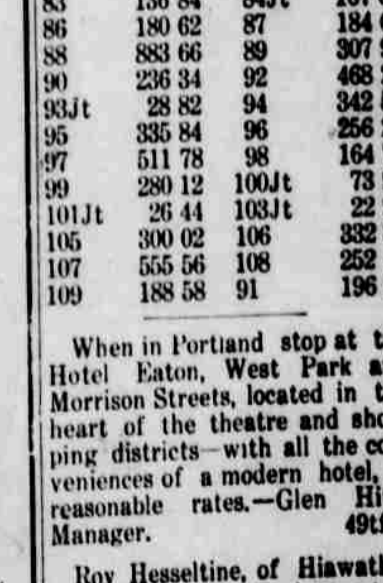
In 1901, at the age of 27 years, he was elected member of the legislature from Lane County, and was re-elected to the same position in 1903, and was made speaker of the House during that session.
