UNION STOCK YARDS

Receipts for the week have been cattle, 1515; calves, 11; hogs, 3183; sheep, 8124.

Cattle run short compared with last week. Some very good steers arriving which commanded a premium. Steer market closes higher than last week, showing an advance of about 16 cents. Cows and heifers weak. All other classes steady.

Hog market opened for the week with a small run and continued short until end of week. Market distinguished by an advance of 5 to 10 cents and much better quality of arrivals.

Sheep continues steady and firm for the week. Somewhat increased arrivals. Yearling wethers are in excellent demand, while lookout for lambs decline. Prime lambs 5 to 6; ewes 4 to 4 3/4; yearlings 3 to 5 1/2; wethers 4 1/2 to 5 1/4.
