All Hillsboro to Visit Portland Land Show, Tuesday, Nov. 10

SPECIAL TRAIN TO BIG EXHIBIT

Train Leaves Hillsboro at 1 p. m., and Leaves Portland at 8 p. m.

The Booster Club has interested the business men of the city in a big excursion to the Portland Land Show, and the date set is Tuesday, Nov. 10. There will be a special train leaving this city at 1 p. m., and returning, leaving Portland at 8 in the evening.

In the morning there will be a reception at the Hillsboro Commercial Club rooms from 10 to 12, and at one o'clock the train will leave with its crowd. There will be refreshments aboard. Portland will be reached at 2, where there will be a reception at the Land Show, and speeches and music will be in evidence. From 4:30 to 5:30 the Portland Commercial Club will tender Hillsboro a reception at their club rooms. Tickets on the railway will cost 85 cents the round trip, and are good on any train returning.

Tickets can be purchased at any of the stores, and citizens are invited to give Hillsboro a day, and go to the big show at Portland. The Booster Club wants Hillsboro to make a big showing. The 85 cents gets you there and back and admits you to the Land Show.
