COUNTY SCHOOL NEWS
The Annual Institute was held
Nov. 4th, 5th and 6th, with the
largest attendance ever registered
in this county.
Supt. R. W. Barnes and Super-
visor Jas. H. Jaek visited all the
106 schools of the county, prior
to the institute and found three
schools in the county fulfilling all
the requirements for a Standard
School. That teachers and offi-
cers have become interested in
improving their schools is shown
by the fact that 16 additional
schools have reached standard
since that time. The schools re-
ceiving all 12 stars for standard-
izing at first visit are Dist. No.
42, Hillsdale, Miss Blanche Haz-
lett, Teacher; Dist. No. 69, Lyda,
Miss Alma Rice, Teacher; Dist.
No. 15, Forest Grove, H. E. In-
low, Supt. Those becoming
standard at a second visit or re-
ported by the teacher to be
standard are: District No. 38,
Orengo; Dist. 97, Verboort; Dist.
No. 79, Witch Hazel; Dist. No.
41, Mountandale; Dist. No. 12,
Greenville; Dist. No. 92, Garden
Home; Dist. No. 6, Union; Dist.
No. 19, Shute; Dist. No. 1, West
Union; Dist. No. 16, Scoggin
Valley; Dist. No. 107, Aloha;
Dist. 24, Barona; Dist. No. 61,
Wallace; Dist. No. 56, Kansas
City; Dist. No. 50, Mountandale,
and Dist. No. 88, Sherwood.
