McWilliams, defendants:— IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON: You are hereby requested to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit within six weeks from the date of the first publication of this notice, to-wit: the 27th day of November 1914, and if you fail so to do for want thereof, plaintiff will take judgment and decree against you as prayed for in plaintiff's complaint, as follows, to-wit:— FIRST: That a money judgment be entered for the sum of Five Hundred Forty Dollars (\$540) and interest from March 1, 1914, until paid at the rate of eight (8) per cent per annum, and for the further sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) as attorney's fees and plaintiff's costs and disbursements against the defendants, Arthur G. Harbaugh, and in favor of the plaintiff herein. SECOND: That a money judgment be entered for the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) and interest thereon from March 1, 1914, until paid at the rate of eight (8) per cent per annum, and for the further sum of Four Hundred Fifty-seven and 10/100 Dollars (\$457.70) and interest thereon until paid from January 1, 1914, at the rate of three (3) per cent per annum, and for the further sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) as attorney's fees, and for one half plaintiff's costs and disbursements against the defendant, W. H. Merrick, and in favor of the plaintiff herein. THIRD: That the sum of the said two money judgments, to-wit: \$740 and \$200, be applied to the satisfaction of the West half of the Northwest quarter of Section Twenty-four (24) Township Three (3) North, Range Three (3) West, of the Williams River Indian Reservation, containing eighty (80) acres, more or less, situated in Washington County, State of Oregon, be entered, and that the Sheriff duly call the same according to the provisions of the statute of this State.
