Quality of stuff offered continues good in the main with trading at fairly good prices. Steers are quoted at 7 25 for tops, best cows and heifers at 6. In line with the markets all over the country swine prices have declined considerably this week, opening at 7 50 and closing at 7. This is on a par with Eastern markets. Receipts continue very light with a strong demand, all offerings were quickly snapped up at 7 for lambs and 5 for ewes. The market is extremely snappy.
