HARRY LOGAN GETS ONE TO FOUR YEARS

Oregon Electric Trainman, Well Known Here, Gets His Sentence

RAN PORTLAND TO FOREST GROVE

Had Two Wives—One at Eugene and One at Portland—One Known Here

Harry Logan, an Oregon Electric brakesman, well known here when he ran on the Forest Grove local, was sentenced to from one to four years, at Eugene, the other day, on the charge of unlawfully living with Nellie Gilmore, formerly of Beaverton, while he had wife No. 2 in Portland, wife No. 1 being in the East.

Logan's arrest and conviction came through the efforts of Mrs. Dora Reed Barber, who was trying to get the Gilmore girl away from Logan, not knowing at the time that Logan had a wife in Portland. When she located the Portland wife she caused Logan's arrest and his conviction followed. Logan gave bond and is now appealing the case to the Supreme Court.

Howard Brownell, a Eugene attorney, is figuring strong in the case. Mistaking Mrs. Barber for the Portland Mrs. Logan, Brownell tried to get her out of the country so she could not appear against Logan. He went so far, according to Mrs. Barber's testimony, that he bought her a ticket from Eugene to Vancouver and sent it to her. Brownell will probably be disbarred and criminal prosecution may follow.

Logan has been in trouble in the East, charged with grand larceny. He broke jail in one of the Eastern States, and his escape was helped by a woman who figured as wife No. 2.

The Gilmore girl has not been seen since Logan's incarceration or, rather, since he was able to give bonds, through the medium of her sister.

C. P. Berry, of Inverness, Mont., arrived here the last of the week to join Mrs. Berry, and they will remain in Washington County several weeks. When he left Montana merely stood at 18 below zero, but the chill is not felt so severely there as down here with a higher register. Mr. Berry says that the Inverness section is developing right along and each year produces a little better crop. He finds much improvement here since he left a couple of years back.

Portland's commercial organizations are always calling on buyers to favor "made-in-Oregon" goods. Why do they not also try to influence Portland merchants to buy the "raised-in-Oregon" product. Yakima potatoes, not as good as Oregon's hill Burbanks, were selling in Portland, the first of the week, at a higher price than Oregon Burbanks. A little reciprocity in matters of this kind would be a mighty good thing.
