SPELLING CONTEST

There will be a county high school spelling contest conducted through the county school superintendent's office. There are 27 schools in the county doing some high school work. We trust that every one of the schools will take up the work, as there is evidence of a need of a revival in the interest of this subject. The rules governing the spelling contest follow:

Rule 1—Any pupil who is carrying at least two subjects above the eighth grade work shall be eligible to enter this contest.

Rule 2—The contest shall begin Jan. 15, 1915, and shall close April 30, 1915. Each lesson shall consist of fifteen words, to be selected from Chew's Practical High School Speller, by the committee, and furnished by the County School Superintendent free to the pupils taking part.

Rule 3—There must be at least three recitations in spelling each week covering the entire work outlined for the week. At the end of each month, February 5, March 5, April 2 and April 30, the teacher will give a test of fifty words selected by the County School Superintendent from the work just passed over and report to him as follows: Number of pupils in class, total number of correctly spelled words, and average for class. (See blank report.)

Rule 4—All pupils making an average grade of 80 per cent in the four monthly tests shall be eligible to enter the annual contest.

Rule 5—The Annual Spelling Contest will be held at Hillsboro, Ore., May 1, and consist of 100 words selected by the County School Superintendent from the previous lessons. A championship diploma shall be given to each contestant making a grade of 100 per cent. The contest will be written with pen and ink. Failure to dot i's and cross t's is a material mistake.

The Washington County Teachers' Association held a regular monthly meeting at Sherwood last Saturday. The meeting was well attended by teachers and citizens. The morning session was held in the school house. The Sherwood ladies gave the association a surprise by preparing a chicken dinner to which all were invited. The afternoon session was held in Weekert Hall, the principal speaker being Pres. Pennington, of Pacific College, at Newberg.
