GERMAN MUTUAL HAS ITS ANNUAL MEETING

Convened in Hillsboro, Monday Afternoon, and Elected Officers LOCAL INSTITUTION IS THRIVING

Carries Over One Million Dollars of Fire Insurance in County

The regular annual meeting of the German Mutual Fire Insurance Association was held in Moose Hall, Hillsboro, Monday afternoon, with a large attendance. This organization carries over a million dollars worth of insurance, and it has over 800 members, all of whom have a voice in the business. For 31 years it has protected farm buildings against fire loss and has never defaulted in a payment. The report of Erwin Ritter, the secretary, shows a splendid condition, and there were congratulations among members when the instrument was presented.

S. E. Graf, of Bethany, the president of the association, was in the chair. The old officers were re-elected, and are: Samuel E. Graf, president; Erwin Ritter, Bethany, secretary; John Meier, Bethany, treasurer; Alfred Guerber, Helvetia, Wm. Hanse, South Tualatin, directors; J. J. Krebs, Hillsboro, and J. J. Wismer, Cedar Mill, auditors.
