MANY SCHOOLS AFTER SPELLING-CHAMPION

Committee Revises Rules For Work in Word Framing

ANNUAL COUNTY CONTEST IN MAY

Pupils Making 98 Per Cent. Eligible to Enter Lists

The committee appointed to revise the rules for the Washington County Spelling Contest has made its report to Supt. E. W. Barnes. The rules have been so changed that it is possible for every pupil to be a "Winner," thus doing away with the painful task of eliminating all but one, who is to be proclaimed the champion.

Rules Washington County Spelling Contest 1915.

Rule 1—Every school in the county should take part. Poor spellers should be encouraged, and no pupil should be excused on account of retardation.

Rule 2—Hicks' Champion Speller and Course of Study will be the basis and guide.

Rule 3—Regular Contest work in the schools will begin Jan. 1, and end April 23. The reports of sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 should be made to the County Superintendent on the following dates: Lesson 80, Feb. 5; Lesson 120, March 19, and Lesson 160, April 23. These reports to show the number of pupils taking part in each grade and in the school; the number of words spelled correctly for each grade and for each school; the average number of correctly spelled words for each grade from 3 to 8 inclusively and for the school. The contest is optional with the third grade.

Rule 4—Schools not in session at the time of making reports in rule 3 may report at any time prior to April 23 on entire number of words in the monthly contest.

Rule 5—In all contests the work shall be written, and all contestants will be held for the full amount of work in Lessons 40, 80, 120 and 160.

Rule 6—Capitals and apostrophes will be observed in the contests. Hyphens will not be observed. Failures to dot i's and cross t's is a material mistake. Committee of three interested teachers shall be appointed to decide technical points, pupils to be given the benefit of doubt.

Rule 7—The grade in which a pupil belongs in spelling is the grade in which that pupil should contest. All grades shall participate except the third.

Rule 8—All pupils in grades 3-4-5-6-7-8 who make an average of 98 per cent. in the third contest will be given a diploma. The school making the highest average will receive a diploma.

Rule 9—The Annual County Contest will be held at Hillsboro, May 1. All pupils in the grades 3 to 7 who make an average of 98 per cent. will be eligible to enter the county contest. The annual contest words will be chosen by the County School Superintendent as follows: For the third grade, 50 words from Annual Contest, Page 43; for fourth grade, 75 words from Annual Contest, Page 81; for the fifth grade, 100 words from the Annual Contests, Pages 81 and 119; for the sixth grade, 100 words from Annual Contests, Pages 157 and 195. All pupils making 100 per cent. will be given a County Championship diploma.

Rule 10—All pupils who take the eighth grade examination in May or June, 1915, are eligible to enter the eighth grade contest. 100 words will be selected by the County School Superintendent from the Annual Contests, Pages 195 and 231. All pupils making a grade of 95 per cent. in the final contest will be exempt in spelling examination for May or June, 1915. All pupils making a grade of 100 per cent. will be given a County Championship Diploma.

Final contest to be written with pen and ink. The committee on version is: Edith M. Pechin, Josephine S. Case, Mary Ryan.
