NEW PROHIBITION LAW REPORTED SOON

Minority Report May Ask That Lid be Put on Altogether

The committee on prohibition laws will soon report a majority bill to allow a resident of Oregon to have two quarts of whiskey and 15 quarts of beer shipped to his address every 30 days, and it looks as though that measure may pass the legislature.

A minority report will also be reported asking that the lid be screwed down so that aqua pura will be the beverage for the Oregonian.

Advertisements will not be allowed to run in newspapers, and booze announcements will not be allowed to disturb the optics of those who have a liking for Oregon scenery.
